The Anabaptist movement, from which the Amish later emerged, started in circles around Huldrych Zwingli (1484 – 1531) who led the early Reformation in Switzerland. Die Amischen (englisch Amish [ˈʔmʔ]) sind eine täuferisch-protestantische Glaubensgemeinschaft. Die Bezeichnung leitet sich vom Namen ihres Begründers Jakob Ammann (1644–1730) ab. Die Amischen haben ihre Wurzeln in der reformatorischen Täuferbewegung Mitteleuropas, vor allem der Schweiz und Süddeutschlands. Amish Mennonites came into existence through reform movements among North-American Amish mainly between 1862 and 1878.
